Thématique Seaside An unmissable, unavoidable major crossing point along La Littorale cycle route is the massive Pont Albert-Louppe, the bridge spanning the place where the Elorn River flows into the Rade de Brest's huge enclosed bay, with the Plougastel Peninsula on the other, southern side. The Plougastel area is renowned for its strawberry production. To understand the local heritage, stop at the Musée de la Fraise et du Patrimoine. Continue on to the historic town of Daoulas, still marked by the maritime influence of the Rade de Brest. It makes a fine stop, with its remarkable abbey now home to a cultural centre that stages major exhibitions, plus it features gardens with plants and trees from around the world that boast medicinal properties.

The route

Crossing the Pont Albert Louppe can prove difficult because this massive, high bridge is exposed to the prevailing westerly winds. Take good care, holding on very firmly to your handlebars. As to the views, they'll take your breath away, whatever the season. Continuing on via Plougastel-Daoulas to Daoulas, you ride along roads shared with motorized traffic and along cycle lanes.

Transports


- Gare de Brest :
 - Several regional trains (TER) for Morlaix, Landerneau, Quimper
 - High-speed train (TGV) Brest > Morlaix > St-Brieuc > Rennes > Paris
- **Bus** : possibility of boarding your bike on BreizhGo buses between Lesneven or Lannilis and Brest.
