Départ Arrivée Landéda Saint-Pabu

Durée Distance 2 h 03 min 30,96 Km

Niveau I cycle often Thématique Seaside

Once past l'Aber Wrac'h, La Littorale cycle route guides you on to explore the Aber Benoît, a deep sea inlet with richly varied landscapes. You cross this aber via the Pont de Tréglonou bridge, nestling at the back of the estuary, the looks of whose banks change greatly with the tides. Look out for bird species that thrive in this environment on the divide between fresh and salt waters, such as shelducks, egrets and wild swans. To learn more about the special natural features of the north Finistère abers, dismount to visit the Centre d'interprétation de la Maison des Abers, covering the topic in detail.

The route

From Landéda up to Tréglonou, the fine first portion of this stage offers a mix of stretches along separate cycle paths and on roads shared with motorized traffic. Expect some slopes if you cycle off to Le Brouennou Marsh, but the detour is worth it. The rest of the stage from Tréglonou to St-Pabu guides you a little inland through an area hardly used by cars. However, take care negotiating the D28 road, after leaving the Vallée des Moulin at Plouguin and up to your arrival at St-Pabu.

When you arrive in Landéda, you can leave La Littorale and head for Brest via Plouvien and Plabennec (37 km and 175 m ascent).

Don't miss

- Landéda: Le Brouennou Marsh and its vegetable gardens (potagers in French); the Pointe du Vill, a headland surrounded by oysterfarms (ostréiculteurs in French)
- St Pabu: the espace naturel des dunes de St-Marguerite, splendid protected dunes; the Vallée des Moulins de Plouguin; the Plage de Corn-ar-Gazel, a fine beach
