

Senlis / Pont Ste Maxence

The Avenue Verte London <> Paris



Exploring the right and left banks, the itinerary of this fourth stage alternates between the charming holiday residences on the banks of the Oise and the powerful industrial sites of Persan and Beaumont-sur-Oise. You will then cycle to the timeless Royaumont Abbey and the outstanding Château de Chantilly. From the medieval village of Senlis to Pontpoint, the route will also give you a taste of some of Europe's famous pilgrims routes (the EuroVelo 3 also called « The Scandibérique » in France). You will be able to discover impressive religious buildings like the gothic cathedral of Senlis or the Moncel Abbaye.

The cycle route

Leaving Senlis: be careful on the D 923a (Compiègne road) before reaching the Hallate forest. Forest road for part reserved for the Trans'Oise. Be careful when going down to Pontpoint.

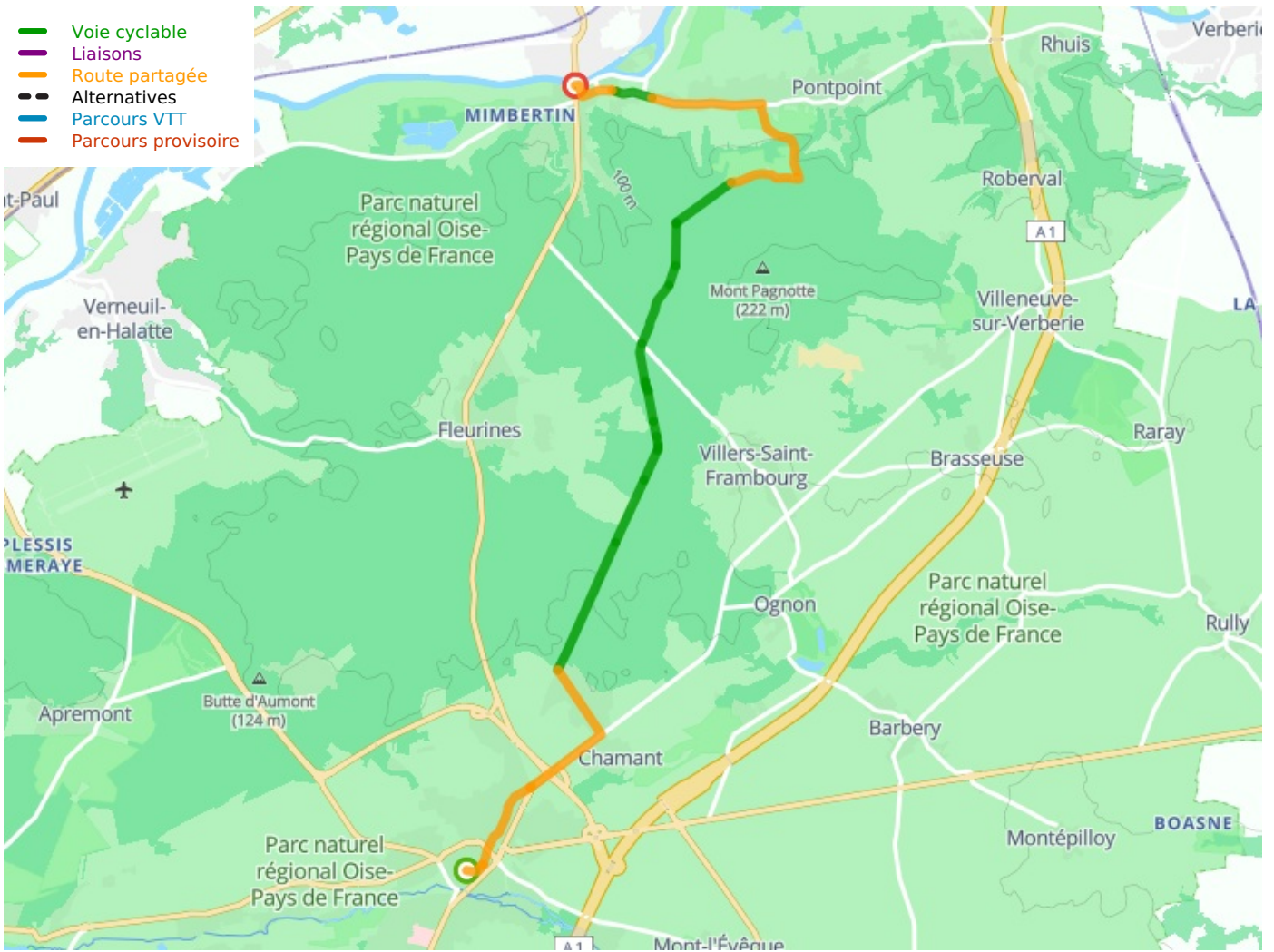

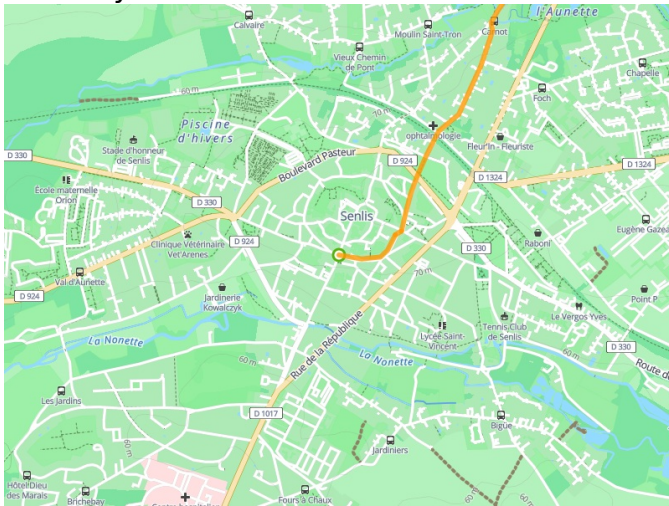
